**Dear Supporters,** 

This past year has been nothing short of extraordinary.

We began the year facing a major transition: a move. We secured a wonderful new home, just across the street from our previous location, co-located with other nonprofits. The new space is full of light, warmth, and community.

To make the move a reality, we needed to raise \$550,000 to outfit the new space, invest in updated technology, and increase staff salaries. Thanks to the generosity of individual donors, foundations, and corporate partners, we reached that ambitious goal. We were —and remain — deeply grateful.

In January, the big move happened. Students, staff, and volunteers came together, donating time, energy, and enthusiasm to ensure a smooth transition. We packed, unpacked, assembled furniture, hung whiteboards and artwork, and turned our new space into a vibrant hub of learning and community. If you haven't visited yet, we warmly invite you to come see it.

And throughout the year, our classrooms were full. We welcomed 88 new arrivals (individuals who have been in the U.S. for 4 years or under) from 29 different countries, including Ethiopia (19), Eritrea (11), Vietnam (10), China, Syria, & Venezuela (6 each). In fact, we served nearly 100 more students than last year. Our students continued to come to classes ready to learn, grow, and be part of the Literacy Source community. They are a true inspiration.

At the same time, we faced unexpected challenges. In early 2025, our federal funding became uncertain. By March, our two AmeriCorps members were placed on an administrative freeze, creating immediate staffing gaps in four classes. Thanks to creative problem-solving, our team's resilience, and another wave of support from this incredible community, we were able to retain both members through the end of the school year. While we know federal funding may continue to shift, we promise to keep you informed every step of the way.

Thank you for standing with us through a year of growth, change, and hope. Your generosity, dedication, and belief in our mission carry us forward. We look ahead with gratitude and excitement for all that's still to come.








